
*A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel*

If he listens to you, you have won back your brother.

If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you :  
*the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge.*

But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community;

and if he refuses to listen to the community,

treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

"I tell you solemnly,

whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven;

whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

"I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask  
anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven.

For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them."

*Matthew 18.15-20*

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.


He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

## *The Eucharistic Prayer*

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**  
Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere,  
mighty Creator, ever-living God.  
We give you thanks and praise for our Saviour Jesus Christ,  
who by the power of your Spirit was born of Mary  
and lived as one of us.  
By his death on the cross and rising to new life,  
he offered the one true sacrifice for sin  
and obtained an eternal deliverance for his people.

Therefore with angels and archangels,  
and with all the company of heaven,  
we proclaim your great and glorious name,  
for ever praising you and singing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. ✠Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

**A**nd so, Father, we bring you these gifts.

We ask you to make them holy by the power of your Spirit that they may be for your People the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ at whose command we celebrate this Eucharist. **(Bell)**

**O**n the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given you thanks he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying,  
'Take and eat. This is my body given for you.  
Do this in remembrance of me.' **3 Bells**

**A**fter supper, he took the cup and again giving you thanks  
he gave it to his disciples, saying,  
'Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant  
shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.  
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' **3 Bells**

**L**et us proclaim the mystery of faith:  
**Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.**

**T**herefore we do as our Saviour has commanded:  
proclaiming his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross,  
his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his  
coming again, we celebrate, with this bread and this cup,  
his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.  
Renew us by your Holy Spirit, unite us in the body of your Son, and  
bring us with all your people into the joy of your eternal kingdom;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the  
fellowship of the Holy Spirit,  
we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:  
**Blessing and 3 Bells honour and glory and power  
are yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

As our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are confident to pray,  
**Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.  
Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.  
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours  
now and forever. Amen.**
